
Jim Matson brought his 1956 Ford Thunderbird to the show and it is absolutely stunning. His son, Chris rode shotgun.



JUST FOR FUN...

Each day you'll find that you can hold this position for just a bit longer. After a couple of weeks, move up to 10-lb potato bags.






